Action taken: *Killed in action 14-16.9.16.*

15 September 1916: The battalion made an attack towards Les Bœufs but received heavy casualties from withering German machine gun fire in the sunken Ginchy-Flers Road. Notwithstanding the casualties, the battalion surged forward and entered the German front line at about 7.15am. Further advances were then made and the positions successfully held against German counter attacks at 6.30pm and 7.15pm.

16 September 1916: The Germans continually bombarded the battalion's positions, a relief not taking place until nightfall when the survivors were relieved to Citadel Camp. Casualties amounted to 440 men killed, wounded or missing. Private Harris was one of those who died on this day.

On 12 September 1916, during the Somme offensive, the 2nd Battalion Coldstream Guards moved from Méaulte, via Bernafay Wood, into the Ginchy sector.
