





William, 30465. 10th Bn. Welch Regt. 2nd June, 1917. Age 21. Son of James Caddy, of 12, Richard St., Cilfynydd, Pontypridd, Glam. III. C. 2.</p>	 <p>The 10th (Service) Bn Welsh Regiment were part of 114th Brigade in 38th (Welsh) Division. L.Cpl Caddy landed with his regiment at Le Havre at the beginning of December 1915.</p> <p>In July 1916 they were in action at Mametz Wood on the Somme where they suffered severe casualties. The Division did not return to major action for more than 12 months. In 1917 they were in action in the Third Battle of Ypres. It was during this battle that William Caddy lost his life.</p> <p><i>"In Flanders fields the poppies blow, between the crosses, row on row That mark our place; and in the sky the larks, still bravely singing, fly Scarce heard amid the guns below"</i> John McCrae, soldier & poet, is also commemorated at Essex Farm Cemetery</p>  <p>Commemorated: Ynysangharad War Memorial Pontypridd, Wales</p>
