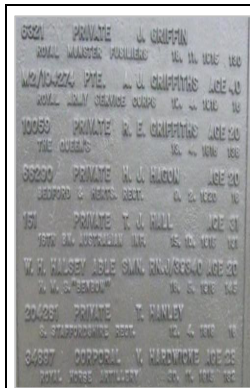

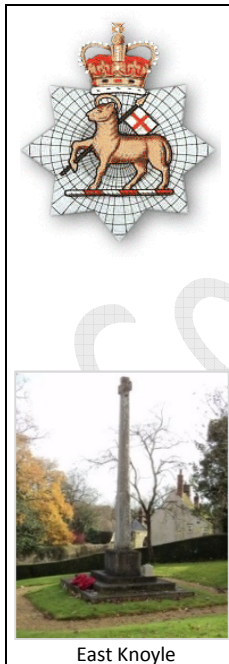

Deaths. On April 13<sup>th</sup> at Wandsworth Military Hospital, Private Robert Eric Griffiths, Queen's Royal West Surrey Regiment, and of East Knoyle, aged 20. *Western Gazette 05 May 1916*

No.3 London General Hospital (Wandsworth Military) opened in 1914 at the Royal Patriotic School in Wandsworth, an orphanage for the children of former soldiers who were moved elsewhere for the duration of the war

GRIFFITHS, Pte. Robert Eric, 10059. 10th Bn. The Queen's. 13th April, 1916. Age 20. Son of John and Augusta Mary Griffiths, of St. Mary's Cottage, South Drive, Wokingham. Native of Knoyle, Salisbury. G.B. 18. 136.
